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<p>Have there been any other important changes in SEN over the year 2016/17?</p>	<p>The Senco reduced her days to 4 days a week, one of which is spent teaching groups of children with SEND in year 6.</p> <p>The school has begun the process of working on achieving the Autism Education Trust (AET) standards. We are being supported by Gonul Hussein, an Educational Psychologist who works for Greenwich.</p> <p>In July 2017 integration meetings with the new Senco were held to determine priorities and next steps.</p>
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
